PROVISIONAL VISITOR ARRIVALS – OCTOBER 2018

Provisional numbers show that visitor arrivals for October 2018 totaled 79,077, a record for the month of October and represented an increase of 1.2% compared to a year earlier.

Increases were recorded in the number of visitors from Japan [925 or 225.6% to 1,335]; Australia [540 or 1.6% to 34,899]; the United States of America [248 or 3.7% to 7,004]; Continental Europe [166 or 4.8% to 3,621]; the United Kingdom [83 or 6.4% to 1,379] and Rest of Asia [17 or 0.8% to 2,228].

There were decreases in the number of visitors from the following countries; Pacific Islands [down 421 or 9.7% to 3,923]; China [down 224 or 5.3% to 4,013]; South Korea [down 196 or 20.2% to 772]; Canada [down 96 or 9.1% to 957] and New Zealand [down 2 or 0.0% to 18,562].

Visitors arriving for holiday purposes accounted for 78.4% of total arrivals, 7.2% came to visit their friends or relatives 3.7% came for business purposes, while 10.7% visited Fiji for other reasons.

Table 1 below presents actual numbers and the 2018 and 2017 comparisons of visitor arrivals for the month of October, January to October and twelve months to October 2018.



Note: Visitor statistics are released monthly using data sourced from the Immigration System. The limited number of tables released is due to the new system which came on line in April 2013.

Figure 1 below is a graphical comparison of Visitor Arrivals by Country for October 2018 and 2017.

In the moving twelve monthly numbers ending October 2018, the total number of visitors to Fiji increased by 4.2% compared with the same period in 2017. Visitors from Japan increased by [62.8%]; Other Countries [14.4%]; Rest of Asia [14.3%]; Continental Europe [9.5%]; New Zealand [8.0%]; the United States of America [7.2%]; Canada [2.5%]; China [1.1%]; Australia [1.0%] and Pacific Islands [0.2%].

Decreases were recorded for visitors from South Korea [4.5%] and the United Kingdom [3.5%].

January to October 2018, showed that visitor arrivals increased by 4.0% over the corresponding period in 2017, up from 700,303 to 728,250.






The majority of visitors to Fiji in October 2018 were in the age range 25-64 (67.4%), which accounts for the vast majority of the working age population. Children aged 14 and below accounted for 16.6% of the October visitor arrivals; 9.2% comprising those in the predominantly retirement age group of 65 and over with the remaining 6.8% were youths aged 15-24.

Figure 4 below shows a significant gender differential in the age groups 20-24, 25-29, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54 and 65+;

Visitors by Occupation

For the month of October 2018 the top 5 Occupational Groups for visitors engaged in gainful employment in their home countries are as follows;


- 1) Technician and Related Workers increased by [1,195 or 14.9% to 9,205].
- 2) Professional Workers increased by [689 or 4.3% to 16,584].
- 3) Legislators increased by [261 or 2.3% to 11,568].
- 4) Clerical Workers increased by [18 or 0.6% to 3,195].
- 5) Service Workers decreased by [1,844 or 27.4% to 4,874].

October 2018 visitors who are not in the labour force were categorised into two major groups. The categories and numbers are as follows;

- 1) Students increased by [1,265 or 11.4% to 12,336].
- 2) Retirees, Housewives, Children & Others decreased by [760 or 4.9% to 14,732].

A total of 13,729 Fiji Residents departed our shores during the month of September of which 10,992 or 80.1% were for a short-term absence of under three months. A total of 1,184 or 8.6% of resident departures were for a longer term absence of 1 year or more.

The reasons for departure as reported by residents leaving for a short-term absence were as follows;

- Visiting Friends or Relatives 43.5%
- Holiday 33.6%
- Business 13.7%
- Employment 3.6%
- Education/Training 5.7%.
